1. Constitution of Classis

- 1.1. Pastor Craig of Calvin CRC welcome everyone and lead us in a devotion based on Ephesians 3:14-21; a prayer for leaders to pray for their congregation; this is a prayer for our inner being; know how grand is God's love for you.
- 1.2. All congregations are represented by their delegates and Classis Eastern Canada is declared to be constituted.
- 1.3. The chair Rev. Jack Van de Hoef, vice Rev. Aaron Thompson, and clerk Rev. Bernie Bakker serve the meeting of CEC.
- 1.4. The chair welcomes several visitors at this time.

2. Reports – Standing Committees of Classis

- 2.1. Stated Clerk - Bernie Bakker Att. 1
 - 2.1.1. Stated Clerk's reported received for information
 - 2.1.2. **Motion: that CEC approve the work of Stated Clerk.** **Adopted**
- 2.2. Classis Interim Committee – Jack Van de Hoef [chair] Att. 2
 - 2.2.1. Jack presented the CIC report
 - 2.2.2. William De Haan, of Charlottetown, joined the CIC via Facetime as a new member.

- 2.2.3. Congregations are asked to review the “Guidelines for CEC Churches Requesting Fund” and send comments to Ron Hosmar or the Stated Clerk. Document attached.
- 2.2.4. **Motion: that when CEC Committee of Pre-Advice has a response contrary to the overture, recommendations of the committee are to be presented in writing as early as possible to the Stated Clerk so that the response to the overture can be sent out to the delegates prior to the meeting of classis. This will give time for all delegates to reflect on the report prior to the deliberation at classis. Adopted**
- 2.2.5. A workshop on “Cultural Intelligence” will held at a later date as the workshop leader has stepped down from her position.
- 2.2.6. **Motion that CEC adopt updated Rules of Procedure as presented. Adopted**
- 2.2.7. **Motion that the October 2020 meeting of CEC be rescheduled to October 23-24 (one week later than usual). Grounds: to make it possible for the Stated Clerk to be present as he has a COD meeting on Oct. 16-18, 2020. Adopted**
- 2.2.8. The CIC approved the purchase of a Zoom software license by the Stated Clerk, at a cost of about \$200 for an annual subscription. Zoom is used for online video meetings and is used extensively by denominational agencies. All committees of Classis would have access to meet using Zoom, which can provide cost savings to Classis by alleviating travel expenses.

4. **Advisory Committees for classis**

4.1.1. Classis Credentials & Instructions: Kemptville & Dixons

4.1.1.1. JOHN CALVIN CRC, TRURO asks about “Challenges of being a small church. Church Renewal.”

Recommendation:

CIC consider these topics – “The challenges of being a small church” and “church renewal” – for discussion at a future classis meeting (perhaps a Friday evening conversation) since these are topics that could be beneficial and encouraging to many of our churches.

We also recommend to Truro – and other churches who are asking the same questions – to look into some of the resources we have within our denomination. Pastor Church Resources (Healthy Church Discernment Process), Faith Formation, the Network or other places, or even sitting down/connecting with some other churches within our Classis and Denomination to find out how others are doing ministry and how we can learn from and support each other.

For church renewal, the Church Renewal Lab, or Go Local, or Churches Leading Change (formerly known as Ridder Church Renewal) are great resources. Resonate representatives like Beth.

4.1.1.2. COMMUNITY CRC, DIXON'S CORNERS asks about “Missionary Support” – our current missionaries (Sheila Dykstra & Jonathan Weverink – Resonate Global Mission, and Mark & Nancy VanderWees – World Renew) are retiring.

Discussion:

Are there other Resonate Global Missionaries that other churches are supporting that could use more funding? Are there other churches in our same position that are looking for another denominational missionary to support – benefit of partnering together to limit excessive travel for missionaries when they are back home for rest.

Suggestions: David and Mary Kromminga; contact Resonate Global Mission or World Renew and ask them for names of missionaries to support

4.1.1.3. BETHEL CRC, BROCKVILLE is considering the practice of implementing a weekly celebration of communion. We look forward to the blessing which the Lord will give to his people as we meet the Lord in Word and sacrament each week.

In order to implement this practice, we will need to ensure that someone is available to administer the sacrament each week. On the Sundays when our Pastor is away, and in the event that the individual bringing God's Word is not ordained in the Christian Reformed Church, we respectfully request the approval of classis for an ordained elder of our church to administer the sacrament of Communion.

If required by classis, we could name two elders for specific approval. Or we request that classis approve any currently serving elder at Bethel CRC, with the understanding that this would only take place in the exceptional circumstance identified above (namely that: (1) the pastor is away and (2) the person bringing God's Word is not ordained in the CRC).

Motion:

Article 55 of Church Order states, "The sacraments shall be administered upon the authority of the consistory in the public worship service by a Minister of the Word, a commissioned pastor, or, in the case of need, an ordained person who has received the approval of classis, with the use of the prescribed forms or adaptations of them that conform to synodical guidelines."

Given Article 55, the Church Order assumes that the people being approved by classis to administer the sacraments are named (and not approved as "all elders currently serving in a particular church"). Therefore, we recommend that classis approve two elders from Bethel CRC in Brockville (whom they are prepared to name) to administer the sacraments. This will meet the need they describe in being able to celebrate communion every Sunday and fit within the bounds of Church Order Article Names to be given to CEC on annual basis – Elizabeth Brunsveld; John Terpstra. Adopted

4.1.1.4. ZION CHRISTIAN REFORMED CHURCH, PEMBROKE - council would like to have permission to have Pastor Eric Strachan administer the Lord's Supper in accordance with Article 55 (of Church Order). This would allow us the opportunity to have communion in the summer. It would also put less pressure on visiting pastors.

Zion CRC of Pembroke give classis a brief background on Pastor Eric Strachan (denomination in which he is ordained, church he served at in the community, history with their church, etc.) so that we may make any recommendation with knowledge of who he is and his connection to Zion CRC.

Motion that Classis approve the request from Zion CRC to give permission for Pastor Eric Strachan to administer the sacraments in accordance with Article 55 of Church Order. Adopted

4.1.2. Ministerial credentials – Cornwall & Brockville

4.1.2.1. Rev. Bert Vanderbeek – request for early retirement as Minister of the Word.

Motion: That Classis Eastern Canada grant Rev. Bert Vanderbeek's request for early retirement as per Article 18, Supplement, of the Church Order. The effective date of retirement will be October 26, 2019.

Grounds:

1. He has made the request and it is supported by the Council of All Nations CRC, Halifax, which retains his ministerial credentials.

2. Synods 1993 and 2011 approved the provision for early retirement, under the reduced pension scale adopted by Synod 2011 (see Church Order Supplement, Article 18). Adopted

In 2018 Classis Eastern Canada gave \$433,376 in Ministry Shares. Under the proposed plan each congregation is asked to prayerfully pledge a Ministry Share amount. This pledge figure will be forwarded to the fall meeting of Classis who will act as an encourager and facilitator of the process. The total amount will be forwarded to the CRCNA.
