- 1. Constitution of Classis and Opening Devotions 8:30 am EST
  - 1.1. Rev. James Kralt, chair of previous CEC meeting, opened with prayer.
  - 1.2. All congregations are represented by their delegates and Classis Eastern Canada is declared to be constituted.
    - 1.2.1. Immanuel CRC, Cornwall not able to send delegates.
  - 1.3. Rev. Lesli Van Milligan, Regional Catalyzer Ontario and Eastern Canada for Faith Formation Ministries, leads in devotions. She takes the delegates through "Seeking God's Face Together" in these turbulent times of COVID, racial tensions, etc. Psalm 46, Proverbs 3:5-6, and Philippines 1:6 are used as a basis to give gratitude for the past, to reflect on what God is teaching us in the midst of present noise, and to listen and discern where God is leading us today. Congregations are encouraged to become familiar with the denominational resources related to Our Journey 2025; see <a href="CRCNA Our Journey 2025">CRCNA Our Journey 2025</a>
- 2. Rev. Paul VanderKooy serves as chair and Rev. Joe Groeneveld is vice chair for the meeting. The delegates are present.
  - 2.1. The chair explains some details re a ZOOM meeting; thanks to Ron Hosmar and Michelle DePooter for serving as technicians for the meeting; ministry representatives and guests are welcomed. A total of 70 people registered for the ZOOM meeting.

- 3.2. Classis Interim Committee [Gregg Lawson, chair] Agenda Att. 2
  - 3.2.1. The following preparations were made for the Classis meeting: Lesli Van Milligan will lead in opening devotions; committee of Pre-Advice for Human Sexuality overture; plus ministries encouraged to send in video or written reports as this will be a ZOOM meeting.
  - 3.2.2. The proposed budget from FAC is recommended for CEC.
  - 3.2.3. Support was given to CMLT for financial support to Brad Bootsma, a seminary student in PEI being supported by Classis Hamilton.
  - 3.2.4. We recommend that Bart Mooibroek be the CEC representative on Redeemer University College Board.
  - 3.2.5. The Safe Church question will be put on Classis Credentials for all councils to answer.
  - 3.2.6. Rev. Dan Hoogland was appointed Classis counselor to Charlottetown CRC.
  - 3.2.7. Motion: that CEC approve the work of the Classis Interim Committee. Adopted
- 3.3. Credentials Committee [Jack Van de Hoef]
  - 3.3.1. Credentials were received from all councils except Cornwall.
  - 3.3.2. Regarding Safe Church question all councils answered "yes" except Renfrew who are working on updating their Safe Church Policy and Truro does not have a policy, but does have a committee, but need to work on getting more people trained.
  - 3.3.3. It is recommended to spend 15 30 minutes to discuss post COVID reluctance.
  - 3.3.4. Motion: that CEC approve work of Credentials Committee Adopted

  - 3.4.1. The proposed 2022 CEC Budget was presented by Eva Reitsma. There are few changes from last year. The per member amount comes to \$77.66.

  - 3.6.2. The following changes were recommended to the CMLT Mandate:
    - 3.6.2.1. <u>Mandate II:</u> "**full time**" is removed. "Rationale: With the growing trend toward and emphasis on bi-vocational ministry in the CRC, we don't want to exclude from support those students who feel called to such an arrangement." **Adopted**
    - 3.6.2.2. Mandate XI" add c. "Members of our Classis pursuing other seminary degrees or diplomas that are intended to support the life and ministry of the church beyond the CRC may apply for a one-time grant of up to \$3000 as an indication of Classis' support and encouragement. These funds would be provided in the final year of the student's program and will not be subject to repayment. Rationale: In March of 2021, Classis approved a \$3000 grant for Rosalyn Berti who is studying at Calvin Seminary but is not intending to enter ministry in the CRC. Because this was a precedent-setting decision, CMLT was asked to revisit our mandate and propose a consistent approach for future similar situations. Classis Alberta South/Saskatchewan has a somewhat similar policy from which we borrowed some of the language."

  - 4.2. **Background:** In the winter of 2020-21 Classis Eastern Canada assigned the delegates of Fredericton CRC and Calvary CRC (Ottawa) to offer pre-advice on two overtures received in response to the "Biblical Theology of Human Sexuality Report".

The committee made three recommendations, which were approved by the March 2021 Meeting of Classis EC:

□ that churcl	hes resubmit	these overtur	es for discu	ussion at a	a later	classis	meeting	allowing 1	for

□ that the four councils involved in authoring the two overtures work together to merge their concerns into a single overture.

□ that the councils and congregations of Classis Eastern Canada be intentional about discussing the content of these overtures and of the "Synodical Report from the Committee to Articulate a Foundation-Laying Biblical Theology of Human Sexuality" during the time leading up to this deliberation.

In September 2021, the delegates of Fredericton CRC and Calvary CRC were re-appointed to serve as on the committee. We received a revised, combined, and resubmitted overture from

the four councils who authored the two previously submitted overtures. We also received a communication from Calvin CRC (Ottawa) detailing a response to the overture, which we have received for information.

Though our primary task was to provide advice to classis on whether to accede or not accede to the overture, our recommendations were again shaped by the need to meet virtually for the October 2021 meeting.

#### 4.3. Recommendations:

4.3.1. We recommend that the churches resubmit these overtures for discussion at a later classis meeting allowing for the possibility of more delegates gathering together in person. Grounds:

- o An in person conversation is a better setting for this topic than a virtual meeting.
- o Delaying the deliberation would create additional space for conversations on this topic to take place within councils and local congregations.
- o Delaying the deliberation until the March 2022 meeting of classis would still allow provide time for the overture to be submitted to Synod 2022 in good order, should classis approve it.
